
AFRICA MEMBERSHIP GROWTH







Of the 24 member organisations who took part in the 2021 census, five have a higher percentage of female board members than the percentage of female physiotherapists in the workforce in their country/territory






COUNTRIES/TERRITORIES WITH DIRECT ACCESS TO PHYSIOTHERAPY SERVICES IN THE AFRICA REGION









AFRICA CASE STUDY



CONGO PHYSICAL THERAPISTS UNION

- The Congo Physical Therapists Union has increased its membership by 43% during the last year.
- The union's current board was elected in 2016 and launched a membership strategy that is beginning to show success.
- During 2020 the union carried out a census of all physiotherapists working or living in the Democratic Republic of Congo, and informed physiotherapists seeking registration of the need to join the union and to pay monthly contributions.
- The ministry of health has also asked all professional associations to provide lists of their individual members who work in the public sector to create a digital database of health professionals employed by the state. This means that each physiotherapist has to provide their registration number as a member of the union.
- The union has also engaged with key physiotherapists, at different levels, to share information about the union's activities and role.
