

#### PHYSIOTHERAPISTS PER 10,000 POPULATION IN THE REGION









**59%** of countries/territories in the Africa region have **full direct access** to physiotherapy services. This is the lowest level across all five regions.




**27%** of the AMC respondents in the Africa region reported direct access only for **private physiotherapy** services.

The most frequently reported **limitation to direct access** was **practice setting** (35%).




## AFRICA HEALTH EMERGENCY STRATEGIES



#### MADAGASCAR: CHANGE IN THE MINIMUM QUALIFICATION REQUIRED TO PRACTICE

The Association of Physiotherapists of Madagascar/Association des Kinésithérapeutes de Madagascar successfully advocated to change the minimum qualification required to become a physiotherapist, from a diploma to a bachelor's degree. The association worked with the ministry of public health and the education authorities to achieve this change in the requirement to practice as a physiotherapist in Madagascar. The campaign also resulted in the creation of a postgraduate master's qualification in research.
