












Of the 14 AMC respondents in the region, 57% reported a similar percentage of female board members to the percentage of female physiotherapists in the workforce in their country/territory

### NORTH AMERICA CARIBBEAN PERMITTED PRACTICE
















### NORTH AMERICA CARIBBEAN DIRECT ACCESS

of countries/territories in the North 29% America Caribbean region have full direct access to physiotherapy services




of the AMC respondents in the North 29% America Caribbean region reported direct access only for private physiotherapy services



43% reported direct access is **not allowed** in the North America Caribbean region


The most frequently reported **limitation to direct access** was **payment**, eg certain payers will not pay for services delivered via direct access (29%).






## NORTH AMERICA CARIBBEAN | CASE STUDY



### **PUERTO RICO – NEW PHYSIOTHERAPY PRACTICE ACT**

The Associación Puertorriqueña de Fisioterapia/Puerto Rican Association of Physiotherapy advocated for a new physiotherapy practice act.

To achieve this, the association met with representatives of the Physical Therapy Examining Board, academic physiotherapy programmes, physicians, politicians, and members of the community. The law to update the legal framework for physiotherapy in Puerto Rico was passed in March 2023, and has yet to be approved.
